Worship in New Ways this Christmas

As I write this before Halloween, it is hard to contemplate our upcoming Christmas worship services. However, holiday decorations will be up any day now, and it will be the first Sunday of Advent before we know it. As we think ahead about this busy time of year, we want make sure you are informed about worship opportunities throughout these holy seasons. Some of our services will remain the same. As always, our Advent Lessons and Carols service will be on the Third Sunday of Advent (December 16). On Christmas Eve, our traditional pageant will be at 4:00 p.m., and our Festive Christmas Eve Celebration of the Holy Eucharist will be at 10:30 p.m., preceded by choral music beginning at 10:00 p.m.

For the fourth year in a row, we will have a Blue Christmas service on December 16 at 5:00 p.m. The name suggests that this service is for people who might be struggling at the holidays, and that is true. Some of the prayers acknowledge that this season is particularly difficult for those who are grieving or going through other hard times. At the same time, this liturgy is appropriate for all of us. It is designed to be more contemplative, an opportunity for respite in the midst of the noise – both literal and figurative – that surrounds this season. The service feels more intimate, as the congregation sits in the choir stalls with candle

This plan has been a while in coming and is happening at Dennis' request, so that he can devote more time to helping with his grandchildren before and after their school day. Blessedly, Dennis will remain in his usual role as Parish Administrator, maintaining the bulk of his duties and

continuing as the friendly face at the front desk and voice on the phone. One tangible change will be a slight reduction in our posted office hours, which will likely shift to 9:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m. three or four days a week and 9:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m. on the other day(s). We are still finalizing this plan, and we will be sure to give you advance and regular notice about this change when it happens.

The other related change is that Dennis will hand over communications-related duties to facilitate the drop in his hours. To fill this gap, we are looking to hire a part-time Communications Director to manage our parish communications - covering such things as maintaining our website and social media presence, publishing our newsletter, formatting our bulletins, and designing brochures and posters. The job will allow for a good deal of flexibility and minimal hours on site, while also giving us the benefit of someone who can focus exclusively on the ways in which we communicate with one another and share the story of our ministry with the greater community. It is an exciting opportunity, one that we hope is budget neutral, assuming we are able to maintain or continue to grow our levels of stewardship support.

Finally, we have one additional exciting announcement. Some of you have met The Rev. Dr. Connie Jones, who has been attending worship and programs here during the last few months. This summer, Connie retired after 12 years as the Associate Rector at Grace Episcopal Church in Yorktown. She had her start in Norfolk (she was ordained out of Christ and St. Luke's in 2003 and served there for three years), and she has continued to live here throughout her ministry. She previously taught American History in the Virginia Community College System for 30 years. Her late husband, Bill, taught Political Science at Virginia Wesleyan before dying of brain cancer in 2007. They have two children and four grandchildren.

During retirement, Connie has decided to hang her hat at St. Andrew's and join us as a Priest Associate, which is a common title given to retired clergy who affiliate as part of the clergy team in a congregation. We are delighted to welcome Connie, and we look forward to sharing in ministry with her. You may see her join us at the altar or as a preacher from time to time, and she also may find a role as an occasional teacher and small group leader, given her gifts and passion for adult formation and pastoral care. Connie will introduce herself further in the January/February edition of the *Saltire* newsletter; in the meantime, please help us welcome her to St. Andrew's! We are so fortunate to have a tremendous staff and leadership team at St. Andrew's. Thanks to all of you for your support, and for sharing in ministry with us!
