MINISTRY NIGHTS AT ST. ANDREW'S

n Monday, July 1, we launched a new offering at St. Andrew's, Quarterly Ministry Night. Part fellowship and part administrative, our intent for these evenings is to foster open and easy communication among our parish committees, and help introduce our ministries to interested parishioners in a hands-on way. Subsequent Ministry Nights are scheduled for October, January, and April, always on the first Monday of the month unless noted otherwise.



Each evening begins with a time of fellowship over a light supper. The Rector will share some words of welcome and introduction, and general announcements. As supper winds down, we split up into various parish committees, which then will conduct their regular discussion. Interested parishioners are welcome to sit in on any conversation in order to learn more about the ministries of the parish and to consider how they might like to be involved.

We hope that this new format will have several benefits. For example, if two committees are collaborating on a project, or need to check in about dates or use of space, they can simply cross the room and meet together. Newcomers will have an easy way to learn more about the mission and ministry of our parish, and committees will have a ready-made mechanism to invite and incorporate new volunteers.

Our inaugural meeting included the following committees: Buildings and Grounds, Christian Formation, Outreach, Pastoral Care, and Worship. In subsequent meetings, we may add Communications, Finance, Parish Life, and Stewardship.




HELP US PREPARE FOR THE WSA BOOK, BAKE, AND HOLIDAY BOUTIQUE (B3) SALE

Mark your calendars! The Women of St. Andrew's will host its annual Book, Bake and Holiday Boutique (B3) Sale on Saturday, October 12. The event will be open from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. and we need you to help us make the event a terrific success!

For the book sale, we are looking for the following items:

- Adult, teen and children's books in good condition (no missing or stained covers, torn spines, loose or marked up pages);
- CDs and DVDs in satisfactory condition (no scratches that interfere with playing) and in their original jewel cases;
- New, unused, and in their packaging Paper items such as wrapping paper, ribbons, bows, gift bags, gift boxes, decorated paper plates and napkins; journals and notebooks; greeting and note cards;



- Games and Jigsaw Puzzles with boxes intact and all pieces present.
- We also need boxes with tops (particularly the ones that photocopy paper comes in or bank boxes). Please bring them in they are great for packing the books and small sale items. We can also use paper grocery bags with handles (no plastic bags, please).

Please DO NOT bring or send the following items

• mildewed, musty, or water-damaged books; Reader's Digest Condensed books; encyclopedias; travel and financial books; dictionaries or thesauruses; textbooks; magazines; souvenir books from places visited; college or town directories; Bibles. Please, do not bring home-recorded CDs or DVDs, VHS tapes, or audiotapes.

The Crazy Crafters are also looking for material. The great thing about crafting is that you can often recycle material that is just sitting around. The Crazy Crafters are looking for any of the following that are in like-new condition:

- Silk flowers, small pine cones or decorative cones (not the ones you see all around Norfolk); wired ribbon in fall and Christmas colors; mini-Christmas tree ornaments;
- Unique beads or charms that you no longer wear;
- Small to medium baskets (good quality, not dollar store or Easter type baskets), preferably without a handle (no large baskets, please);

Hilarie Wakefield Dayton and Little Stitch Studio



Earlier this spring, *Inside Business* featured a profile of parishioner Hilarie Wakefield Dayton and her business, Little Stitch Studio. Located at 807 Shirley Avenue in Ghent, the studio offers individual and group sewing and crafting classes, workshops and parties.

The article details how Hilarie turned her passion for sewing, which began at only four years old under her grandmother's watchful

eye, into a thriving business. She told the reporter, "I remember sitting there at the table with her and becoming hooked," she said. "That's all I ever wanted to do."

Hilarie taught her first private lesson in late 2014, and business quickly took off. Needing more space, Little Stitch Studio has been at its current location since July 2017.

She also recently has written a book to help sewers get started and build their skills. Released earlier this summer, "Sew Bags: The Practical Guide to Making Purses, Totes, Clutches & More; 13 Skill-Building Projects" is available on Amazon and at Barnes & Noble Booksellers. A book tour is planned for this summer.

VESTRY UPDATES

At the May meeting, the Vestry reviewed the newly revised Safe Church policies adopted by the Diocese of Southern Virginia. These policies were approved by the General Convention of the Episcopal Church and handed down to dioceses for implementation. Each parish in the Diocese is asked to approve the revised policies and put them into practice. Our Vestry voted to approve at this meeting. The policies include many changes to better safeguard our parishioners. First, they extend protective practices and awareness re: elder abuse, in addition to child abuse. They streamline requirements for background checks and for safe church training. They also require every who holds key access to our buildings to undergo a basic level of training (called "universal" training), in addition to staff and key volunteers who take more advanced training modules. Harper Bathel serves as our Safe Church representative. Please let Harper or the Rector know if you have questions.

At the June meeting, we welcomed Allison Enedy, Director of Communications, who shared her early work and impressions with the Vestry. We also had some brief conversation and brainstorming about communications ideas and needs in the parish. Additionally, the Rector briefed the Vestry on a couple of community initiatives with which he is involved. He is assuming a leadership role in Hands United Building Bridges, serving as the co-chair along with two others. And we are reforming a coalition focused on mental health awareness and resources; the coalition is undertaking an initiative targeting the business community as partners in reducing stigma related to mental illness.
