n early 2009, a search committee began looking for a new rector for St. Andrew's. After an incredible 25 years with the Rev. Charles Joy, we had become accustomed to knowing a superior priest as our friend and celebrant. We could only pray that we would be so fortunate as to find another rector with comparable capabilities.

When the committee learned that a promising young priest in Raleigh, North Carolina, was interested, they had to

investigate. When they listened to John Rohrs speak and share his faith, and especially as they had the chance to get to know him better, they knew he was the one. Even better, his wife, Andie, was an extraordinary Episcopal priest in her own right! How were we to attract such a "dream team" to St. Andrew's?

From the beginning, the committee formulated a detailed parish profile to help us identify where we were as a church and to help communicate to a prospective candidate how we viewed ourselves.

As we widen our efforts to our West Ghent neighborhood, we are looking for volunteers from St. Andrew's to help with *Taylor Elementary's Read With Me* literacy program. Designed to assist students in Pre-K through Grade 2, the program pairs volunteers with a child who would benefit from additional reading support. The time commitment is only 30 minutes, once per week. There will be an information and training session in September with the program beginning in October. For the past several years, St. Andrew's has financially supported the *Foodbank of Southeastern Virginia's Backpack Program.* This nationally-recognized initiative distributes nutritious food to children at the end of the school day, before weekends and/or school breaks. Bags/backpacks are filled with child-friendly, non-perishable, and easily-consumed food for children to have at home on non-school days. Students are identified by school personnel as being food insecure by a variety of criteria. At present, the Foodbank serves 45 elementary schools in our area, including Taylor Elementary.

We wish all children in our congregation, in our neighborhood, in our community, and everywhere a challenging, enriching, supportive and successful new school year!

As an associate vice president at ODU, he led the creation of the Institute for Innovation and Entrepreneurship, which consolidated entrepreneurial efforts and aided the university in capitalizing tens of millions of dollars in high-tech and medical research.



St. Andrew's is a Home for EVERYONE

We are proud to be recognized by The Hampton Roads Faith Inclusion Network and by Churchclarity.org as a parish that welcomes ALL people to worship at St. Andrew's.

Earlier this summer, St. Andrew's became a member parish of The Faith Inclusion Network (FIN) of South Hampton Roads. FIN is a non-profit, grass roots organization dedicated to helping faith communities develop inclusive ministries for people with disabilities and helping families affected by disability to find welcoming and accessible places to worship in South Hampton Roads.

Church Clarity is a crowd-sourced database of Christian congregations scored by a team of volunteers based on how easy it is to find a church's Actively Enforced Policy online. They currently evaluate church websites for policies that impact LBGTQ+ people and women in leadership. St. Andrew's is listed as a "Verified Clear." Clear scores are given to churches whose policies can be easily found on their websites' primary pages, and the language in the policies is clear and contains all necessary information.
