NEW BISHOP FOR SOUTHERN VIRGINIA

n September 21, the Rev. Susan B. Haynes was elected from a field of six candidates to serve as the 11th bishop of the Diocese of Southern Virginia. Four lay delegates from St. Andrew's and its four clergy joined hundreds of other electors from the 102 parishes of the diocese to pray, sing, and vote for the person they believe God is calling to this position.

Currently rector of St. Paul's Church in Mishawaka (South Bend), Indiana, Susan Haynes will be consecrated bishop on Saturday, February 1 in Williamsburg. St. Bede's Catholic Church has graciously



invited us to use their very large sanctuary (and parking lot) for the event, so there'll be room for everybody who wishes to attend. The consecration of a bishop requires the hands of three bishops, chief of whom will be our Presiding Bishop, the Most Rev. Michael Curry, who is a spectacular preacher. (Do you remember him from Prince Harry's wedding?) The procession, the music and the celebration, as well as the preaching, will be over the top, and *you are invited!*

The diocese is the oldest geographic administrative unit in the Christian church, and is overseen by a bishop. (The biblical Greek word *episkopos* means "overseer" and is the root of the name of our denomination.) The Diocese of Southern Virginia stretches from Danville to Norfolk, the Eastern Shore, and Richmond south of the James.

A bishop, in addition to being most visible when visiting parishes for confirmation and when presiding at annual councils, is responsible for the process of identifying candidates for ordination and their training, along with the encouragement of lay ministry. In cooperation with parish vestries, she supervises the calling of new rectors, and all deacons answer directly to their bishop.

She oversees the budget and all the agencies and ministries of the diocese. She is both pastor to all the clergy of the diocese, and when necessary, their disciplinarian. Bishop Haynes will participate in the House of Bishops in the governance of the Episcopal Church.

While it may seem that a bishop is like a CEO, remote from ordinary Episcopalians, we have every sign that Susan Haynes will be a warm, approachable, intelligent and hands-on sort of leader – not just for clergy, but for youth and people in the pew. She's devoted to racial and interfaith reconciliation and lay ministry. She was a music major and has a nice sense of humor, too. Prepare to fall in love with her. And be all means, get out your 2020 calendar and circle February 1st for her consecration. You won't want to miss it!
