Our Mission

St. Andrew's is a vibrant, inclusive parish, formed in the fellowship of Christ. We strive to be a place of hope for all people, to reach beyond ourselves, and to manifest God's love in the world.



Children's/Youth Formation and Fellowship

Nursery: We offer qualified, compassionate, and well-staffed nursery care for children ages six weeks to four years.

Children's Chapel: This interactive worship experience for children ages four through second grade takes place in the Auditorium during the first half of the 10:15 a.m. service. Children gather in the church entryway prior to the service.

Sunday School: Sunday School runs from 9:00-10:00 AM most Sundays during the program year. We utilize a variety of activities to nurture our children and youth in their journeys of faith. A schedule is available on the website.

Youth Group: Youth in grades six through twelve gather on Sunday evenings and other times for food, fun, and mission. Check the website for schedules.



Adult Formation and Fellowship

Adult Forum: This is our flagship formation offering for adults. Sunday mornings we gather at 9:00 AM for discussions on a variety of topics related to the practice of faith. A schedule is available on the church website.

Foyer Dinners: This rotating dinner fellowship program helps members get to know each other in fun and informal settings.

Men's Fellowship Breakfast: This new ministry brings together the men of the church for fellowship and engagement in our community.

Newcomers Class: This four-week class in the winter/spring is for newcomers who would like to learn more about St. Andrew's and the Episcopal Church.

Theology Before Lunch: This small group meets weekly on Thursday mornings to discuss theology and life.

Two or Three Young Women's Fellowship: Two or Three is a fellowship and book discussion group for young women in the church.

Women of St. Andrew's: This is a fellowship and service ministry for all the women of the parish. The Women make grants toward church and community needs and sponsor various special events.

Women of the Way: This book discussion group for all women focuses on deepening faith and supporting each other in life's journeys.

Young Adult Fellowship: Events planned throughout the year bring together young adults and families for formation and fellowship.

Mission and Ministry

Access AIDS Care Cook-In: On the third Sunday, six months of the year, parishioners and others from the community gather at St. Andrew's to prepare meals for families affected by HIV/AIDS.

American Red Cross Blood Drive: St. Andrew's participates with other Ghent-area churches in hosting a monthly blood drive on a rotating schedule.

Catholic Worker Sandwich Ministry: On the fourth Saturday of each month, sandwiches made by parishioners are distributed to those who receive food from the Norfolk Catholic Worker.

Church Mouse: The Church Mouse is a gift shop housed at St. Andrew's and operated by the Women of the Church.

Fall Festival: On All Saints weekend, St. Andrew's celebrates a community festival featuring food, arts and crafts, clothing and household boutiques, and

fine choral and instrumental music. Hands United Building Bridges:

HUBB is an interfaith, inter-racial network of clergy and churches working for racial dialogue and justice.



Laundry Love: In partnership with other churches, we host a monthly ministry to launder the clothes of those in need and spread kindness one load at a time.

Mentally Healthy Norfolk: St. Andrew's serves as a convener of this community coalition working to reduce stigma and increase access to mental health care.

Mission and Ministry Commitee: This committee oversees our outreach in the community and determines grant support for local organizations such as Ghent Area Ministries, ForKIDS, Lost Boys Foundation, and many others.

Norfolk Emergency Shelter Team: NEST is a collaboration of local churches ministering to homeless persons in Norfolk. The City has taken over the program but we still offer support.

Rise Against Hunger: A new annual tradition, this event features St. Andrew's members and friends assembling 12,000 packaged meals for delivery to hungry people around the world.

Sudanese Refugee Ministry: In partnership with The Lost Boys Foundation, we provide support toward the education and health of Sudanese refugees.

Wellness Ministries: We host a weekly yoga class, a twice-weekly women's fitness class, and a weekly centering prayer group.

Inclusion and Hospitality




Gospel-based Mission and Ministry

The stained glass windows in our sanctuary depict scenes from Matthew 25, in which Jesus commends those who nourish the hungry and thirsty, care for the sick and needy, visit the prisoner, and welcome the stranger. These images inspire and define our call to ministry in the world.

Eucharistic and Baptismal Faith

Each week we come together to seek solace and renewal in the healing power of the Holy Eucharist. Our celebration of thanksgiving for Christ's resurrection binds us as a community and lifts our hearts, and we carry that spirit into our daily lives and work as we live out our baptismal vows.





Spiritual Formation for All Ages

We bring inquiring minds and open hearts to our journeys of faith. We know that we do not have all the answers, and we value thoughtful conversations and genuine community. We are committed to fun and meaningful formation and fellowship for children and youth, as well as adults.

Joy, Beauty, and Wonder

We worship with joy and reverence. We value the elegance and ritual of Episcopal

liturgy, the beauty of sacred music, and the comfort and tradition of our sanctuary. We also celebrate the wonder of God's creation by using our flowers and gardens as instruments of praise.

Our History

Pounded in 1911 to serve the newly developed Ghent section of Norfolk, St. Andrew's began its life in a small wooden chapel. The rector was The Rev. Myron Marshall, who conducted his first service on December 3, 1911. By the end of 1912, the fledgling parish counted more than 100 families as members, reflecting an emphasis on hospitality and faith formation for all ages that continues today.

The current sanctuary was built in 1921 and was designed by the noted architect John Kevan Peebles, himself a parishioner at St. Andrew's. In 1948, members expanded the 1921 structure with a two-story parish house, which includes the present-day auditorium, classrooms, and church offices; the narthex and parish hall were added in subsequent decades. In 2003, members



commissioned 18 new stained glass windows that depict scenes from Matthew 25, a call to service that inspires our ministry in the world.

Putting love into action has long been a central value at St. Andrew's. In the 1980s, The Rev. Charles Joy and several parishioners became key supporters of early HIV/AIDS ministry in Hampton Roads, efforts which evolved into the formation of Access AIDS Care. We continue to support that ministry along with a temporary homeless shelter, a program to feed the hungry, and many other activities in the community. We

were also the first Episcopal Church in Virginia to elect a woman to the Vestry, and the first church in our Diocese to bless a same gender union prior to the advent of marriage equality.

St. Andrew's has also been a center for sacred music and the arts. Organ and choir music lifts our hearts in praise, and we regularly host community concerts and other special events. Our annual Fall Festival on the weekend of All Saints is a celebration of art, music, and community fellowship.

In 2011, we celebrated our centennial with a series of events, culminating in a successful capital campaign. Over the last decade, attendance has grown more than 50%, with many new families and expanded ministries within and beyond our walls. With updated facilities and growing numbers, our parish is poised for a new era of faith and service as we enter our second century.

Sacraments and Sacramental Rites

Holy Baptism: Holy Baptism is the sacrament by which a person is born into new life with Christ and received into the community of faith. We celebrate baptisms on Sundays throughout the year and on special feast days.

Holy Eucharist: Holy Eucharist, or communion, is our principal act of corporate worship. We celebrate the Eucharist each Sunday and Wednesday throughout the year, in addition to special feast days. All baptized Christians are welcome to receive the bread and wine at God's altar.

Holy Matrimony: Traditional and alternative services of Holy Matrimony are available to parishioners, family members of parishioners, those interested in membership, and others with special affiliations to this congregation. This includes both same-gender and opposite-gender couples.

Unction (Healing) is offered weekly at the Wednesday Eucharist. **Confirmation** for youth and adults is offered annually. **Reconciliation of a Penitent** (Confession), and **Burial of the Dead** are offered by request. Please contact the parish office.
